

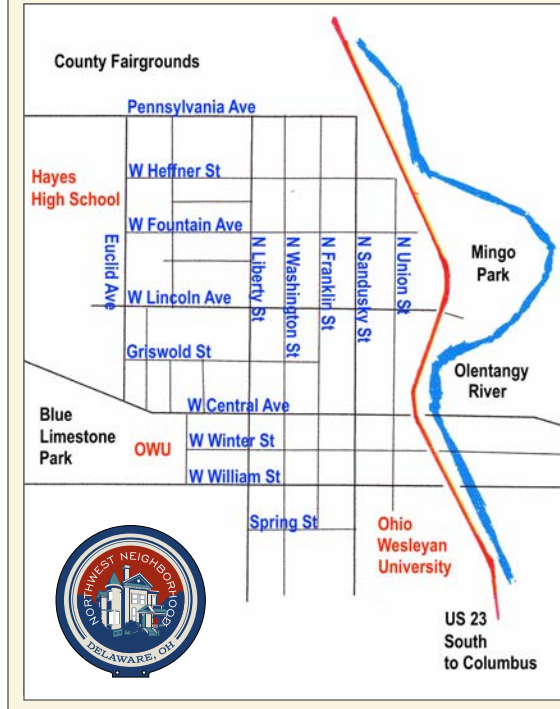


NATIONAL REGISTER

Delaware's Historic Northwest District, home to city founders and entrepreneurs in the 1800s, boasts more than 500 homes and carriage houses listed on the National Register of Historic Places. From the earliest Federal style (c. 1826) to the modern Craftsman (c. 1915) and the French Eclectic (c. 1930), the area includes:

Gothic Revival	Italianate	Second Empire
Romanesque	Prairie	Queen Anne
Colonial Revival	Shingle	Folk Victorian
Mission	Tudor	Stick Style

Enjoy the benefits of historical homeownership without architectural regulations. Victorian mansions are within blocks of the robust Downtown Historic District, where another 79 buildings are listed on the National Register. Notable individuals who called the Northwest Neighborhood home were Rutherford B. Hayes, 19th U.S. president, and Vincente Minnelli, film director of the musical *Meet Me in St. Louis*.

- Delaware City Schools sports, theater and arts events

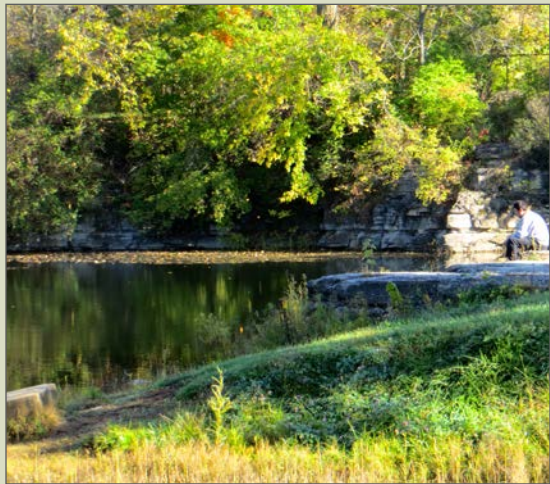
HISTORICAL OPPORTUNITY
